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Heathrow Northwest Runway Consultation

Introduction

On 25 October 2016 the government announced its support for a new northwest runway at Heathrow.

The government believes a new northwest runway at Heathrow will strengthen and develop the UK's links with the rest of the world, offering new and improved opportunities for tourism and trade.

The potential expansion of Heathrow would have an impact on local communities, and the government has been clear that a world-class package of measures should be put in place to support them. Expansion can be delivered within existing air quality requirements, and this will be a condition of planning approval.

The next step is a 16 week public consultation on a draft National Policy Statement (NPS). An NPS sets out the policy that applies to decisions on whether major infrastructure projects can go ahead. The consultation will include a number of local events for people to find out more about the proposals.

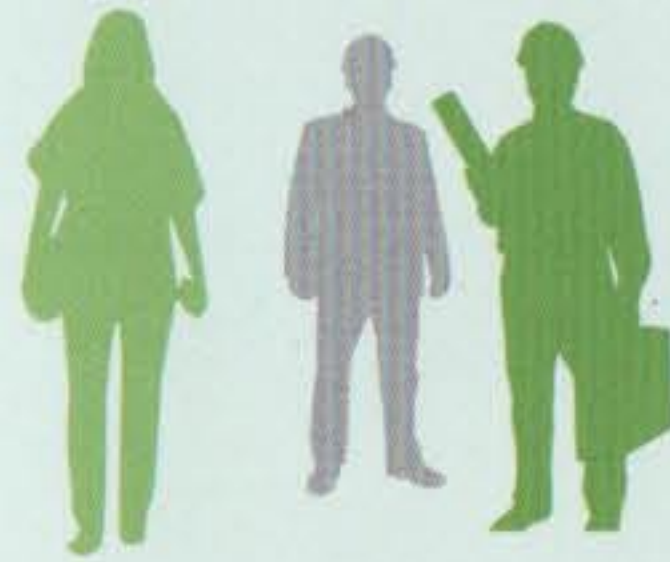
